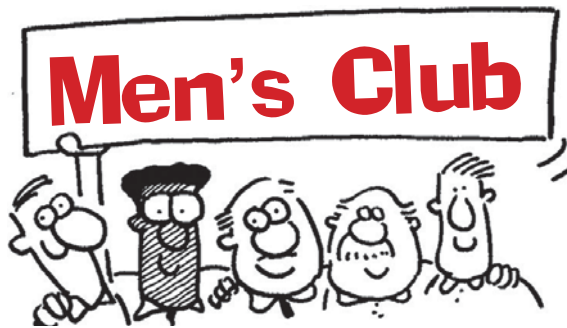

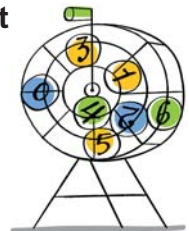

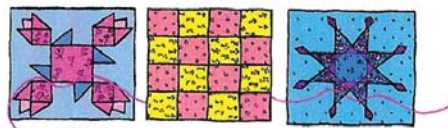
The remaining three (3) Women's Club meeting programs will be discussed and chairperson's chosen to run the meetings.

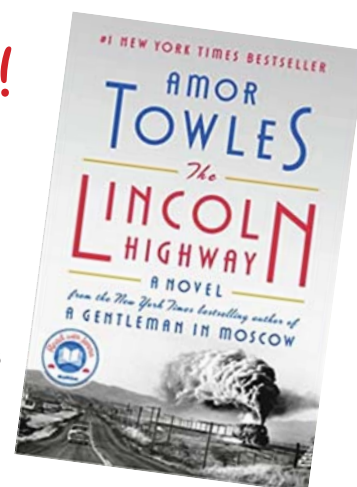


## Join the Book Club!

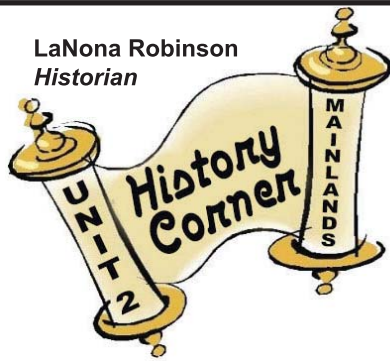

## Did You Know ???

Did you know the lake in Unit 2 covers 14 acres? This lake has an official name: Lake Tamarac which you will find on maps of the area. Lake Tamarac was a spring fed lake and was enlarged when Mainlands was built. Before the seawall was added there was the Mainlands Beach. Rowboats, paddleboats and canoes were allowed on Lake Tamarac. No data has been secured to identify when the seawall was built but probably in 1969. Several people have said that in the 1950s there

was an amusement park further north on US19 which rented canoes where you could travel from the park waterways through various lakes to Lake Tamarac.

The Mainlands golf course opened as an 18 hole executive golf course. Home owners in Mainland's could join the Golf Club and play when they wanted or if they did not wish to join the golf club, they could pay green fees when they wanted to use the course. Verbal history says that in the 80s the golf course was sold to a private concern as many non-golfing residents in Mainlands did not want to pay for the golf course.

The commercial buildings at the front of Mainlands were originally called the MAINLANDS VILLAGE SHOPPING CENTER. Our shopping center originally opened with a grocery store, drug store, commercial bank, and two savings and loan associations. There was also a post office substation where P.O. Boxes could be rented and all houses had mail delivered to the house not to street side mailboxes. There was also a doctor's office in the shopping complex. Mainlands had bus service that stopped on Mainland's Blvd. Original Mainland's marketing material said, "Owning a car really isn't necessary...if you are a bicycle rider, you can ride to the Village shopping Center as the streets are a quiet joy."

Originally house prices began at \$9,500 and many people selected sliding screen doors when they purchased their house to convert the garage into screened rooms.

In the future look for information on past social activities and more surprise recollections from original residents and their families.

## ATTENTION SENIORS!

This is a great service for all Mainlanders who do not have an automobile or someone to drive them to appointments. For only \$4.50 each way you can make advance reservations and not have to worry about how you are going to get there and back home.

See the information below for instructions on how to submit an application for this service.



### PSTA Access: Door-to-Door Service

- PSTA Access is an ADA paratransit, shared-ride, advance reservation service for those whose disability prevents use of the PSTA accessible bus system.
- Rides cost \$4.50 each way.
- Travel within Pinellas County where and when PSTA local bus service is available.

### Applying for PSTA Access

- Call (727) 540-1888 for a PSTA Access application or to schedule a mobility consultation interview.
- Send the completed Access application to PSTA.
- Applicants will get a letter explaining the ADA eligibility decision, how to appeal the decision, and how to use services – all residents eligible for PSTA Access also get Mobility-on-Demand (MOD).
- **Call 727-540-1888** one month before eligibility expires to re-certify and keep riding.

## SOLAR PANEL/SOLAR COLLECTOR INSTALLATION POLICY

The Florida Home Owners Solar Rights Act, Chapter 163.4 simply states,

“A property owner may not be denied permission to install solar collectors.”

If a homeowner chooses to install solar collectors, the homeowner must complete an exterior alteration application.

### Additionally:

1. The installer must have all required operating permits and insurances.
2. Due to the fact that the tile and pitched/flat roof on which the collector is to be installed are interconnected, they will **NO longer be repaired, replaced, or maintained by the Mainlands of Tamarac by the Gulf Unit Two Association.** The homeowner must sign an acknowledgement to that fact.
3. If the homeowner removes the solar collector and then replaces the roof without solar panels or collectors, using the current Unit Two roofing contractor, then the Association will again be responsible for repair, replacement, and maintenance of the tile and pitched/flat roof.
4. The solar collector must be installed as to conform to the existing roof line and appear as part of the original tile roof.
5. The homeowner is responsible for power washing and painting of the roof prior to installation. **After** installation, the Homeowner must maintain the washing and painting of the roof in accordance with Unit Two schedules and specifications.
6. The solar collectors must be installed on the rear portion of the tile roof as long as it does not conflict with the Florida Home Owners Solar Rights Act.
7. The homeowner is required to notify the potential buyer(s) that the tile and pitched/flat roof is **NOT** the responsibility of the Unit Two Association. This must be done prior to the interview process.



## FISHING



- ❖ **Prohibited:** Fishing in any Unit Two lake or canal; This includes “catch and release.”
- ❖ **NOTE:** Catch and release fishing is permitted on a resident’s own property or with homeowners written permission.
- ❖ Cast netting is **NEVER** allowed.

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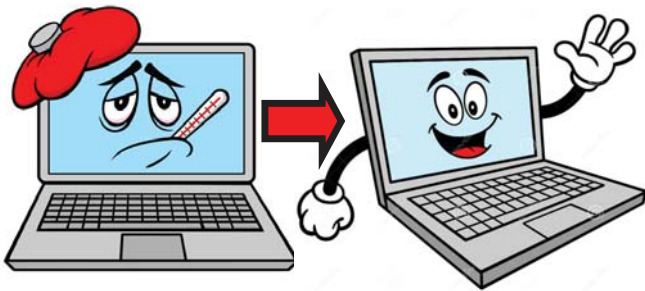

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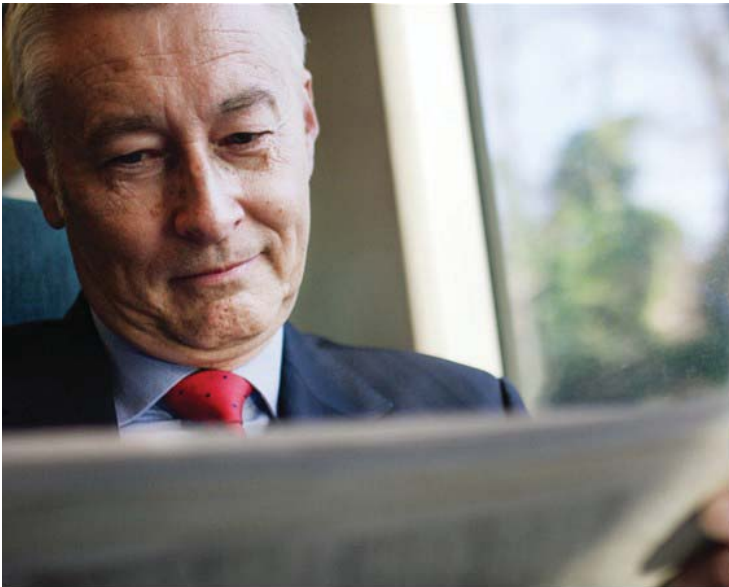
