We have several events coming up this year where all 3 clubs will be participating. We can always use volunteers, please check the bulletin for sign-up sheets.

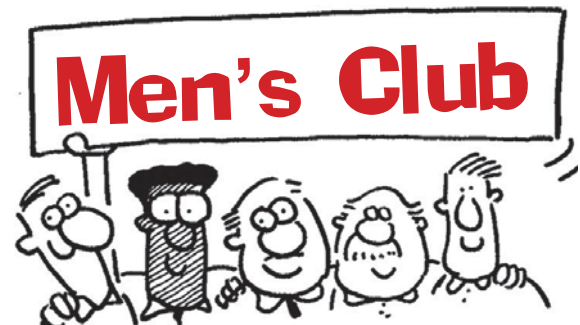

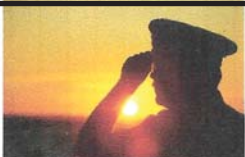
Our next event will be our annual Unit. 2 Veterans' luncheon which will be held on Nov. 11th at noon. Please sign up in the rec hall.
