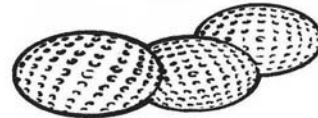

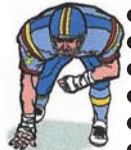

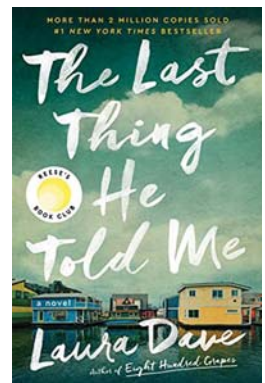
Join the Book Club!

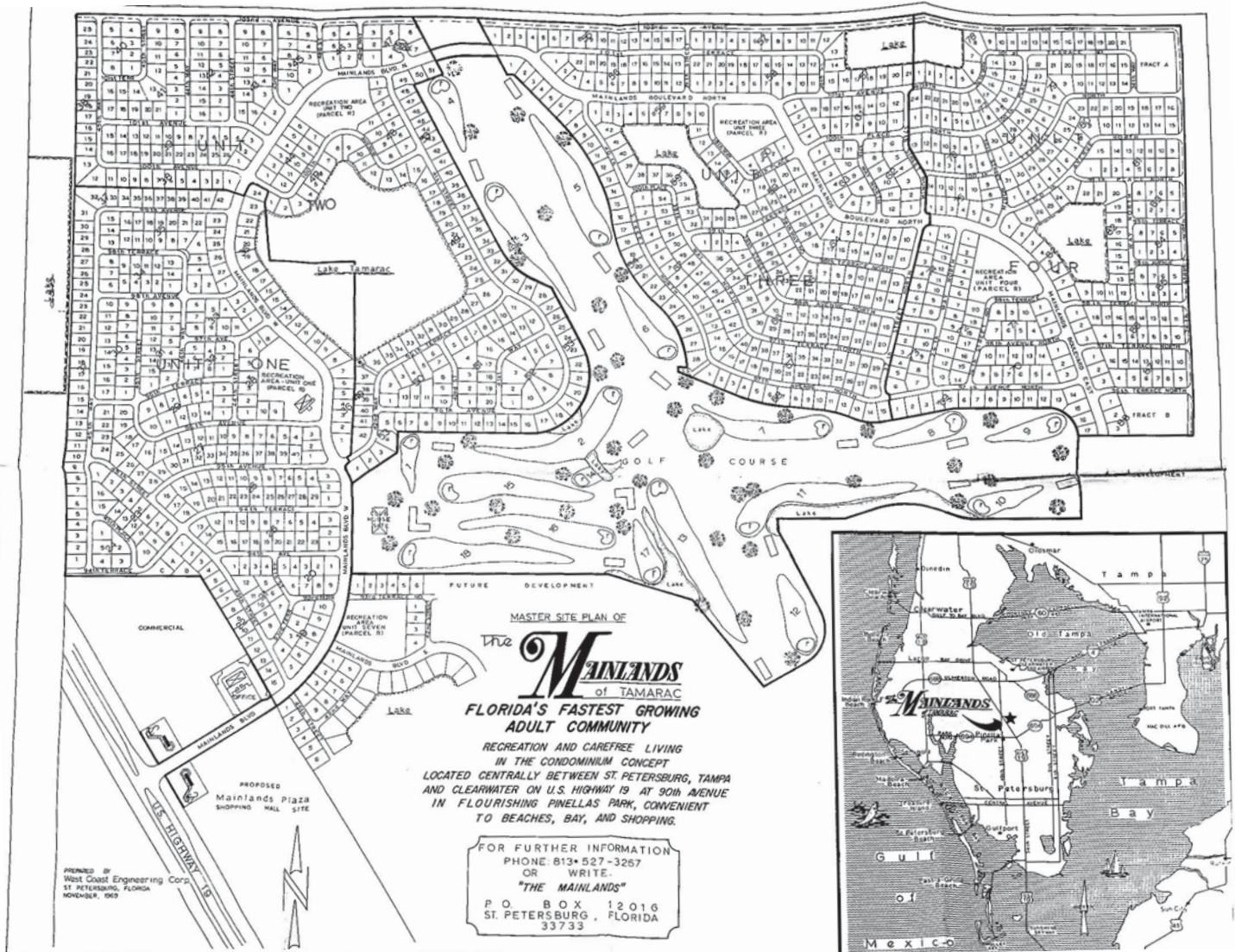


MAPS MAPS and MORE MAPS

There are many maps of Mainlands. Engineering maps, advertising maps, golf course layout maps and more. Each map had a purpose and each had a different description of Mainlands. Many early maps used different names for Mainlands. The map in this article is from an original engineering map that was given to residents in 1970 when they built a house.

Early brochure inserts offered a layout of the model and small map of Mainlands showing different unit locations. In the 1970s, promotional maps of Units 1 and 2 (These are the only unit copies of these maps I have) listed prices for additional costs due to lot size. These costs were added to the initial building costs. These maps also listed the maintenance fees on each lot by size. In 1970, the maintenance fee for an Eden with a one car garage was \$36 per month.

In a news article in the late 70s, Mainland's Resales, Inc., described Mainlands as "an adult condominium development of storybook charm whose residents pack a wallop in local politics." Another ad from the late 70s by Mainlands Construction Co., used the name "Mainlands West" to describe the "Grand Opening of the Newest Section." If you have maps or Mainland's marketing information from the 80s or 90s give me a call (LaNona Robinson 727 578-9966) so we can make copies for our Mainland's History Files. Watch the History Board in the clubhouse for pictures of "Mainland Maps."

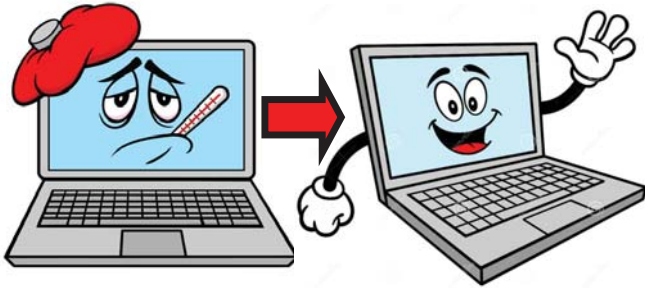
