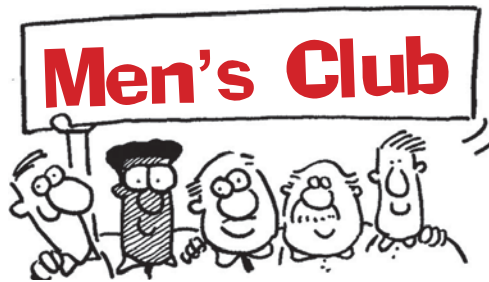

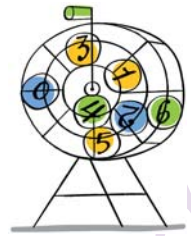

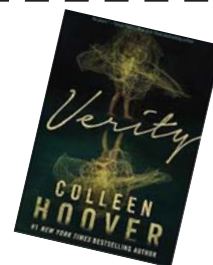
Join the Book Club!

The March Book club was a great meeting with good attendance--Fun. Lively. Interesting, Insightful. The "Word of the Month" was "Disengaged. The husband in our book *The Last Thing He Told Me*, had to become disengaged from his family. It was the only solution to save their lives. This was a powerful book. Our favorite part of the book was the ending...unexpected, but it had to be. As always our conversation digressed into stories of our lives and our relative's lives and family secrets and hidden stories. For "Show and Tell" LaNona brought an original first edition Beatrice Potter's Book, "Wag-on-Wag."

For March we shall read *Verity* by Colleen Hoover. This is the story of a struggling writer who accepts a job to finish the stories of a successful author who is too sick to finish her books. The struggling writer finds a secret manuscripts that uncovers multiple family secrets of the author. Should she disengage from the job and the author? Should she keep the secrets of the manuscript? Should she tell all? You will have to read the book to find out.

We also choose an April Book. For April we shall read *Extraordinary Life of an Ordinary Man* by Paul . Lots of discussion about this one, should prove very interesting.

The 1970's Mainland's Sales Pitch!

Two sections from 1970s Mainland's Sales fliers are in the accompanying photograph. Notice the Custom Features and Additions sections. Home features we expect today, such as Air Conditioning, were optional additions. Other features which we assume are included in homes today were called "Custom," such as Hot Water Heaters, Circuit Breakers and Mirrors in Bathrooms. And some 1970 sales features seem a bit odd today, such as promoting "Sanitary Sewers." These sections from original Mainland's sales fliers will give you a good idea of the items included in our houses when they were first built.
