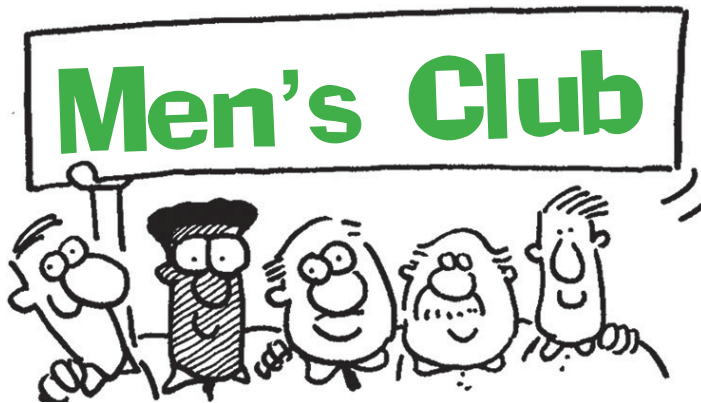

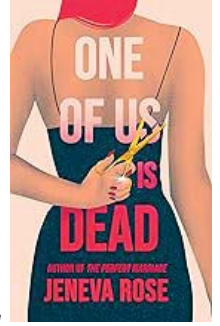

“My Kingdom My Kingdom for a 2 Car Garage”

To paraphrase Richard III from Shakespeare, most of us would love to have a two-car garage. They are not common in Unit 2. Did you ever wonder why? Well the answer is MONEY or as Shakespeare would say “Pieces of Silver.” A well-liked and well-priced model the DEVON, (which was later renamed the DRAYTON), came with a carport. Hence today, we see DRAYTONS in Mainlands Unit 2 with carports and many with a one-car garage added on later or at purchase. But...if you wanted a two-car garage in 1969, it cost an additional \$2195. “ALACK ALACK,” you say. “What Doth thou mean?”

It means having a two-car garage in 1969 was all about the Benjamins. Turning the carport of the Drayton into a one-car garage was \$995, but a two-car was more than double the price.

Remember a Drayton cost \$15,990 in 1969 and came with a carport. Hence adding a two-car garage was financially significant. Look at the promotion below for the DEVON which was the original name of the DRAYTON. You will see the price of additions such as air and heat, screened porch and a two-car garage. Makes sense doth it not why most DRAYTONS have a carport or one-car garage. It was just too many pieces of silver for a two-car garage in 1969. As Shakespeare said in the Winter's Tale “Better burn it now than curse it later.” We wish all our previous owners had burned through \$2,000 for a two-car garage so we would not curse our one-car garages today.

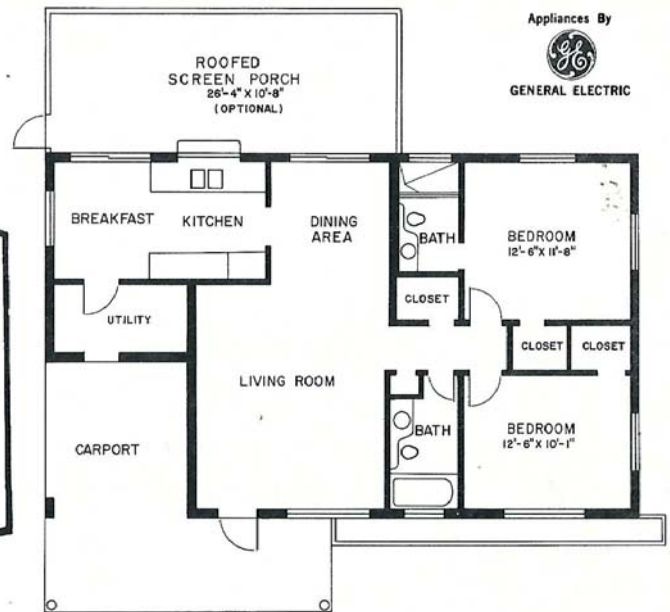

with buttercream icing. Something special for everyone.

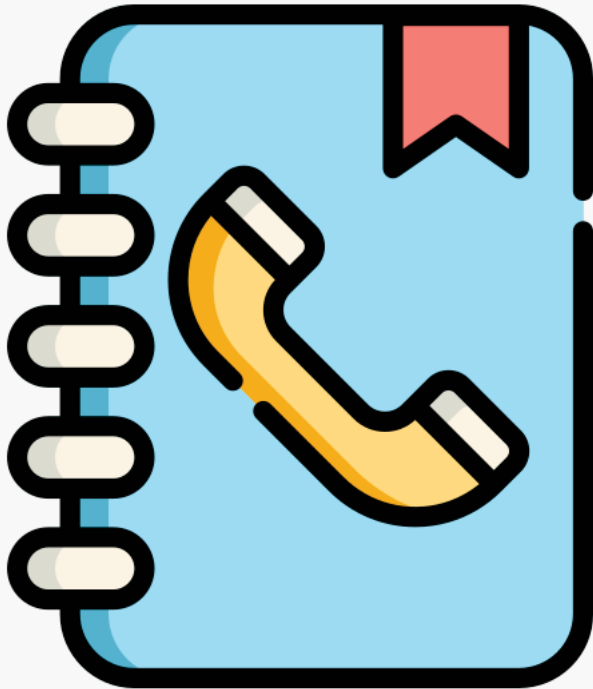

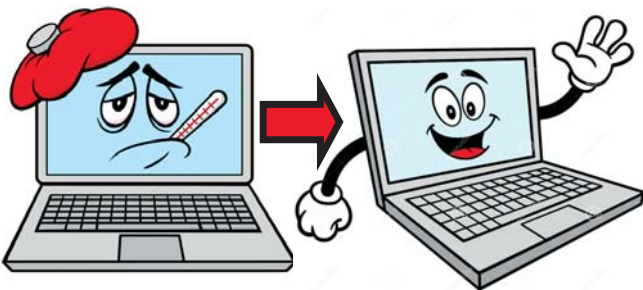


