

Pinellas Park is growing. Mainlands is a great addition. But, where to shop? While there was a basic shopping center in front of Mainlands, Park Plaza at 49th and Park was the "**IN**" place to shop in 1970 in Pinellas Park.

It had a news stand (If you remember news stands you are showing your age). Eckerd Drugs, Publix, Ace

Hardware Firestone, Barber Shop, Woolworths with lunch counter, a waterbed store, a clothing store, and Cappanellas restaurant. This is according to a Pinellas Park Facebook History site. The restaurant and Firestone are still there.

Look at the cars. What were you driving in 1970. I was in high school in 1970 and drove a 1964 Wildcat Buick. Mainlands



was growing and people were shopping at Park Plaza.

Eckerds, the shoe store, Woolworths Laundry mat and more. Love the cars and the shopping variety at Park Plaza. All you wanted was there.

How will you get to Park Plaza? In the late 1950s, (10 years before Mainlands), the Department of Transportation took this photo of 49th and Park prior to widening Park Blvd. The traffic light.. well I think it was the only one in town. How our shopping has changed. From Park Plaza to an easy chair and laptop. We will always need a place to shop.




