Before placing your vote, you owe it to yourself and all of your fellow Mainlanders to do everything you can to "get the facts."

It is hoped that every household will take this important decision very seriously, by casting a vote. When you do so, please consider that this vote is not just about you, or about Unit 3. It is about what the best option is for us, our friends, neighbors, and the entire Mainlands community as a whole.

The purpose of the Alteration Application is for protection of the home owner by confirming that contractors are approved (management must approve) and to keep our community consistent and pristine. Some, but not all, of the alterations that require an Application are:

Painting of driveways, front doors & shutters

Installation of hurricane shutters

Placing unapproved items in carports, on patios and around perimeter of home

Installing new flower beds

Removing Trees/Plants outside existing flower beds

Trimming trees

Planting of new trees

NO Parking on street overnight (includes work trailers)

Overnight parking in clubhouse lot with parking permit

Replacing A/C units





WHAT IS THE 120 CLUB?

The 120 Club is administered by the Social Club. Up to 120 people sign up and pay \$20. Each person is assigned a number. Weekly, from the beginning of October to the beginning of March, a number (name) is drawn, and the winner collects \$20. 

Sometimes the Courier has an odd number of pages and we end up with a blank page. We pay for a page whether it has print on it or not. So, I am filling this "blank" page with miscellaneous stuff of general interest.

The Mainlands water distribution system is pretty basic: One main water pipe feeds water into our community. The water passes through one water meter that determines the total number of gallons used, and is then distributed to each of the 1937 homes in Mainlands. Each month the water consumption of each household is determined by dividing the total gallons used by 1937 households. Therefore, we all pay the same amount for our water each month.



We are all on 1 water meter and get the same bill as our neighbors, so please don't get upset if the roof cleaners use your faucet to clean your neighbor's roof.

UP IN FLAMES

There's a hidden fire hazard in almost every home....it's the **dryer vent**! Over time, your dryer vent fills with lint. Fires can occur when lint builds up in the dryer or in the exhaust duct. Lint can block the flow of air, cause excessive heat build-up, and result in a fire. Have your vent professionally cleaned by a certified appliance repair person.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission estimates that over 15,000 dryer related fires occur each year causing an estimated 97 million dollars in property damage.
